

Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of the City of Maud

July 20th, 2026

The Maud City Council met in regular session on July 20th, 2026.

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Jimmy Porterfield.
2. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Porterfield.
3. The Roll Call was made by City Clerk David Zeller. Present for the meeting were Council Members Tara Kestler, Bobby Shatto and Chad Votaw. Lee Davis was absent. City Attorney Mat Thomas was also absent. The Mayor Declared a Quorum.
4. The Mayor welcomed the visitors.
5. No public comments.
6. Chad Votaw moved to approve the consent agenda. Tara Kestler seconded. The vote was Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye, Shatto-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.
7. No items removed.
8. Police Chief Casper Vinson reported that in June, the Department had 17 agency assists, and 43 calls for service. The Seminole County Board of Commissioners approved our Jail housing agreement. They assisted the Pottawatomie County Warrant team with several warrants. For the month of July, the Department had 26 agency assists and 80 calls for service. Chief Vinson was dispatched on a call for a non-verbal child who walked away from his residence. This led to an investigation which resulted in the arrest of the mother for Felony Child Neglect, and placing bodily fluids on a government employee. The PD attended the Fire Department's fireworks show, and assisted the public works department the next day in picking up the debris from the fireworks show. Office Mason Hill tendered his resignation on July 3rd, and is no longer with the department. The PD attended the Annual Roundup club rodeo on July 17th. We had torrential rainfall during the event. The Rodeo events on the 18th were canceled due to the muddy condition of the Rodeo Grounds. Chief Vinson has been researching bail bond procedures and has put together bail bond procedures to be discussed later in the agenda. He also submitted for consideration an ordinance to raise the Tech fee and add a Training fee for citations issued.
9. Emergency Management Director Zeller had nothing to report.
10. Chad Votaw moved to approve General Fund Purchase Order 10496. Tara Kestler seconded. The vote was Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye, Shatto-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

11. Bobby Shatto moved to approve Street and Alley Purchase order 20074. Chad Votaw seconded. The vote was Shatto-aye, Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

12. Mayor Porterfield and Clerk Zeller presented the Agreed upon procedures Audit report for FY 2022. Bobby Shatto moved to approve the Audit report. Tara Kestler seconded. The vote was Shatto-aye, Kestler-aye, Votaw-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

13. Mayor Porterfield presented quotes for a new zero-turn mower. After discussion, Tara Kestler moved to purchase a 42" Ferris mower from 405 Equipment Company. Chad Votaw seconded. The vote was Kestler-aye, Votaw-aye, Shatto-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

14. The Council discussed Ordinance 2026-02, Amending Part 6, Courts, increasing the Tech Fee and adding a Training fee. After discussion, Chad Votaw moved to approve the Ordinance. Tara Kestler seconded. The vote was Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye, Shatto-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

15. Mayor Porterfield and Billing Clerk Amanda Needham presented a plan for an event called OK Roots on September 5, 2026. The event would be a craft vendor event to be held at the Rodeo Grounds. Chad Votaw moved to approve the event. Tara Kestler seconded. The vote was Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye, Shatto-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

16. Mayor Porterfield presented estimates for remodel of the bathrooms at the Rodeo Grounds. Tara Kestler moved to approve an estimate from Smith of all Trades in the amount of \$6414.00 for remodel of the bathrooms to include replacing the sheetrock with corrugated metal. Chad Votaw seconded. The vote was Kestler-aye, Votaw-aye, Shatto-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

17. Chief Vinson presented recommended Bail Bondsman procedures to allow the Municipal Court to utilize Bail Bondsmen. Bobby Shatto moved to approve the Procedures. Chad Votaw seconded. The vote was Shatto-aye, Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

18. Mayor Porterfield addressed the Council regarding damage to the Rodeo Grounds after the rainfall event during the Rodeo. He has talked to the Roundup Club about them assisting in repairing the damage. He also addressed the fact that we have no written lease agreement with the Roundup Club that anyone can locate. This subject will be on next month's agenda.

19. Bobby Shatto moved to adjourn. Chad Votaw seconded. The vote was Shatto-aye, Votaw-aye, Kestler-aye. The Mayor declared the motion carried and adjourned the meeting at 8:07 PM.
